STUDENTS ELECTED TO LEAD THE 2024 – 25 PINK PEARLS CLUB



Enrichment Activities Kick-Off on a High Note



Some long-standing relationships have been continued, such as our enrichment activities, which now include the Big-Buddy Mentoring, DARE, and Male Initiative programs. The Big-Buddy Mentoring Program is an afterschool program that provides extended learning opportunities that combine academic support with enrichment activities to foster a child's overall growth and developmentcurrently, the program services, on average, 60 kids daily. DARE Program, a substance abuse prevention program designed to equip 5th-grade students with the necessary skills for resisting peer pressure to experiment with tobacco, drugs, and alcohol; and the Male Initiative, sponsored by iCARE, a monthly program designed to work with all males' students focusing on making healthy lifestyle choices, along with guest speakers speaking on pivotal prevention messages that affects young males.
